

BULLYING AT SCHOOL

Tasks for international groups

1. Sum up the results of the questionnaire carried out at your school and send them to the pupils of your international group by e-mail.
2. The coordinator arranges a chat.

Talk about the following topics and questions:

Comment on the results. In what way do they differ from those of your partner schools? Or are all the results similar?

Talk about the latest development in the discussion about violence and bullying at schools in your country.

Do pupils see the necessity of solving conflicts in a non-violent way?

Do you think the results of the questionnaire are a reflection of the public opinion in your town or country?

What should or could be done to improve school atmosphere and reduce bullying?

Exchange and compare your ideas and experiences.

3. Analyze and evaluate the data of the questionnaire, your chat and your observations in your and your partners' countries .

Suggest a list of things that should be changed at your school in order to improve its atmosphere and reduce violence at school.

Send your ideas to the coordinator of your group.

4. The coordinator gives a report on realistic/possible measures his group has come up with to reduce bullying at school. He points out difficulties that have to be overcome creating a school where pupils and teachers can live together peacefully and happily.
