Detailed planning of this year's project

International groups

The participating students will be divided into 8 international groups. The teachers have to divide their students into smaller groups (of 3-6 students) and send a list to Andreas who will form the eight international groups by 15th October. The international groups will be named after Nobel Prize winners (Shirin Ebady, Nelson Mandela, Rigoberta Menchú, Aung San Suu Kyi, Mother Teresa, Martin Luther King, Dag Hammarskjöld and Bertha von Suttner).

Nobel Prize winners:

Each international group has to present a portrait of their Nobel Prize winner on the net. The portraits have to be sent to Andreas (Stuttgart) who will put them on our Eirene website.

Personal profiles

Each student will present himself/herself in a personal profile. The profiles of the participating students of the same school will be put on that school's website (on the Eirene-part of the website of each school). The teachers will send the link to the Eirene-part of their school's homepage (where we can find the students' profiles) to Andreas by 28th October.

Video

If possible, the groups in each school will present their school and themselves in a short video which is to be sent to the partner schools.

Statistics:

Each school will do a research on the ethnic mix of the 17-year-old students at their school (where do the students and their parents come from?). Andreas and Frank (Stuttgart/Sindelfingen) will send you an Excel-file for filling in the statistics of your school. The results will be sent to Andreas who will put them on the website (by 22nd November).

Film

Susanne (Copenhagen), Per and Annika (Sweden) will make key questions and send them to Andreas. Detailed tasks for the international groups will be made by Agathe and Frank (Sindelfingen). They will include creative tasks, too (22nd October).

Hazel (Scotland) will provide some tasks for the analysis of some film scenes in a "media-critical way". (22nd October). The tasks will be put on the website by Andreas (Stuttgart)

Photo Gallery

Each project group in a school will make a photo gallery presenting pictures of young people representing (extreme) youth cultures. Guidelines will be worked out by Martin and Andreas (Sindelfingen/Stuttgart) by 14th October. The photo gallery will be published on our website (put it on the Eirene-part of your school's website and send the link to Andreas or send the whole photo gallery to Andreas). The photo gallery will be presented at the Budapest meeting in January, too. Bring a slide-show or multi-media-presentation and/or some posters to Budapest.

Short story

We will look for a short story dealing with violence in youth cultures. Hazel (Edinburgh) will try to find a suitable short story until the Budapest meeting in January. Key questions and detailed tasks for the international groups will be discussed at the Budapest meeting.

Evaluation of this year's project

Andreas will make a questionnaire for students, teachers and headmasters for evaluating this year's project by 8th April. The results will be presented on our website (restricted area) and discussed at our first meeting in the next project year.

Some general remarks for this year's project:

Results of the work

All the results of the work in the classes/project groups in each school will be presented on our website. They will be put on the Eirene-part of each school's website (send the link to Andreas) or they will be sent to Andreas who will put them on the website.

At the end of the project year we will make a folder with the results of our work to present it at school and send it to our national agencies.

Communication between the students

The international groups will communicate in the forum on our website. All communication on the detailed tasks concerning the film, the short story, etc. takes place in the forum. The teacher who is responsible for a specific work group has to check his/her group's work in the forum. In addition, the students can also use the chatroom on our website or send emails.

Planning of next year's project:

Ideas:

We will work on violence in an international context. We will choose one international conflict to analyze. The differences of specific national interests among the countries participating in the Eirene Project should be worked out. We will look at the different presentations of this conflict on TV, newspapers and other news media in our countries. The way international conflicts are used as a topic for creating computer games could be an interesting task for the students. Another possibility is to create an international strategy-game the groups could play (Frank and Andreas will come up with an ideal until the Budapest meeting).

The last step should be a creative task about the students' ideas of what they can do to make the world less violent, what they can do for a world of peace and freedom.

Procedure of working in the project:

The well-tried methods of working together over the last years should be continued. The parts of the work concerning the presentation of the school, the student-groups and motivating the students for the work on the project will be the same as in the last years.
